WORKSHOP: CUTTING LOOSE WITH TIED WEAVES

Tied weaves create patterned fabric with floats of limited length. It's also an extremely versatile weave capable of amazing results. One of the most overlooked and minimized features of designing and drafting tied weaves and developing new patterns is the tie-up. One threading can provide a multitude of different treading options – from singles and pairs to Dukagang and taquete. Why? Because of the ability to make subtle-to-major changes in the tie-up, treading sequence, and wefts. Participants will learn the fundamentals of tied weaves and explore a number of variations.

Experience Level: Adventure seeking beginner through advanced weavers. This workshop is limited to 20 participants.
